June was a busy month. DM2 had workshops in Bolivia and the USA. Many of you upheld us daily in your prayers, for which we are thankful. We especially felt your prayers on our trip to Bolivia. There has been strong opposition among certain sects to the clear teaching of the Gospel. Not only were there threats to somehow hinder us from entering the country, there were also strong attacks on the congregation in Los Negros that hosts our workshops. Although those who oppose were unsuccessful in stopping the workshop, they did do a lot of damage to discourage to the moral of many.

With that said, I am excited to announce that the work continues to progress well and the churches of Bolivia are sending a team of 4-7 teachers to Peru to host their first international workshop. This is planned for September 10-15, 2013. Please keep these leaders in your prayers. Also, some of the Bolivian teachers have been asked to go to Spain to teach a workshop there. This is another opportunity, should the Lord provide.

Amazingly, the churches represented by the group of pastors directly taught by DM2 took up

an offering that totaled more than \$1100.00! This is the second time they have blessed DM2 in this manner with their generosity, and it brought tears to my eyes. I was reticent to accept the gift, but they insisted they want to be a part of DM2 around the world and feel so blessed to have the opportunity to participate in this way. These funds will go toward our upcoming trip to an undisclosed country in Asia.

FROM JOHN WRY:

Bolivia June 2013

I couldn't possibly put everything that happened on this trip into words, but I will mention some things that come to mind. It really was a particularly special trip for me, and I have to say I am glad I got to be a part of the team. I truly believe in the DM2 strategy, as it tries to stay close to God's Word and I believe we are starting to see a real and profound impact in the lives of the believers in Bolivia. Praise God!

This trip was different from the others in that, upon meeting the Bolivian brothers and sisters, I noticed a general sullen feeling. It wasn't bad, just not the usual happy tone. We could tell right away something was not the same. The biggest sign was no soccer playing after hours. Usually, they play soccer from 10pm to 12pm.

After some conversing with the brethren, we were informed of the situation affecting their spirits. Simply put, the churches were being attacked from many different directions. Not only were pastor Roberto Morales and his church under attack, but when talking to brothers from different parts of the country, their stories were of similar nature. They had been under attack as well! Most of all, the message of the Gospel was under siege.

We know the enemy does not want the Gospel to be sent forth, but that is just what is happening in Bolivia. Like never before, the pastors and leaders taught by DM2 are excited about the things of the Lord. Although they have been walking with the Lord for years, they have a new understanding of His grace and are willing to go to great lengths to share it with others, but of course scripture says *"...all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution."* 2 Timothy 3:12

About half way through the workshop, Bret's stomach decided to go into convulsions. In the middle of the night I was rudely awakened by what sounded like someone jumping on someone else in the bed. I sprang to my feet and headed for the sounds. It was not a nice scene. I was expecting to see guts on the floor and two men fighting...so you can imagine my surprise when, through the darkness, I found Bret sick with a high fever and vomiting—not the kind of thing accompanied by sweet dreams.

The next morning when we went in to see how he was, it was like visiting someone in a comma state. Not a whole lot of movement going on. A little breathing here and there – I think. That was about it.

The thing was, we were entering chapter 7 of 1 Corinthians – a critical chapter, and it was Bret's turn to teach. It was a crucial moment in the orphaned lives of these three DM2 teachers - me, Carlos Tellez and Joe Aguilar. We were all a little nervous, especially Carlos since he would have to teach Bret's sections. After some very brief reviewing, Carlos was up. We all took our places: Carlos up front, Joe in the back praying and preparing for the next session, and John doing what Carlos would have been doing on the next PowerPoint. For some reason, I could imagine Bret laughing it up there in the room. Maybe this was his method of preparing us for taking a field on our own sometime soon!?

It was about 10am. Bret was still not showing up, and Carlos was doing an excellent job teaching when suddenly it happened. Somebody threw Carlos a curve ball. It was a loaded question and Carlos' answer did not convince some of them. Finally, it was lunch time and we were saved by the bell.

At this point, we went up to see Bret. He was responding at least. I tried to reassure him things were going along okay with only a small uproar... but when I came back a few minutes later with some water, he was already leaving the kitchen, coffee in hand, showered, hair combed, dressed and ready to go! It was like he had never been sick! A few minutes later, Bret was up again teaching.

What a great opportunity to be put to the test. Bret insists he didn't plan on abandoning us like that, but we have our doubts. Regardless, God used the situation for good and it gave Carlos, Joe and me a good idea of what it's like to go "solo." What an adventure! And yet, really, God was in control the whole time. No worries.

This trip, more than any of the others I have had the privilege to be a part of, was an experience of real solid evidence of God's working in people's lives. Several local churches in

Bolivia are under tremendous attacks, but the believers are allowing the grace of God to be visibly evident and at work in their lives. The last night before we left, many of the brothers and sisters shared testimonies. It was truly humbling to see the maturity of their Christian faith put in words. There is that working of the Holy Spirit within us that produces fruit only He can produce. It's the real deal; this work cannot be counterfeited and all is to the glory of God. It's grace at work within us! Titus 2:11-12 tells us that grace is teaching us how to live the Christian life. Amazing!

Another thing of great impact to me is the fact that virtually all of the attendees now understand, and can put forth in clear words, a pure Gospel. Many even clearly articulate the Gospel for the believer (the second tense of salvation) according to Romans 6-8. This understanding, through the teaching of DM2, is having a tremendous impact in the lives of the believers to firmly ground them in God's Word.

Over the years in ministry, I have seen people trying to achieve similar results by developing new methods. Somehow though, these man-designed methods just don't produce the

The trip to Los Negros, Bolivia was an eye-opener for me as to what God is doing in the lives of my new-found brothers and sisters. It was truly amazing to see firsthand the results of DM2's efforts to teach the Word of God to a group of pastors and church leaders who in turn go back to their own churches and teach it to others. God's Word has not returned empty and has led to the spiritual growth of those who have attended the training. Even now, there are plans being made by church leaders in Bolivia to train church leaders in Peru. They push forward with nothing but faith in God to provide the resources for such a long arduous trip—40+ hours by bus - and all for the glory of God. The work of the church in Los Negros (where DM2 Field Director, Roberto Morales, is the pastor) goes forth in the midst of great opposition. Keep them in prayer that God would provide them with wisdom and courage to confront that which attempts to halt the work of the church.

The week in Los Negros not only gave me a peek into what God is doing in the lives of the Bolivian church, but also provided me with spiritual growth that was much needed in my life. I found myself pouring over the Scriptures. I learned how to prepare for teaching in such a way as to allow the Spirit to teach me. I also learned many biblical principles and church doctrine. I came away with a new purpose in my life and a stronger desire to study God's Word, apply it, and then
