What do quitting your job, skipping classes, and a dead professor have in common? The latest DM2 Bolivia workshop!

I am amazed at what some people will do to be taught the Word of God. Here are the stories of three Bolivian men in their twenties who came to the June 2012 Old Testament Panorama workshop.

One young seminary student told me that if he missed three days of class, he would fail, regardless of his grades. On the Thursday of the workshop he willingly missed his third class, failing that subject.

When another seminary student told his professors he would miss their classes, they asked him why. His response," Here we get philosophy, but there (at the DM2 workshops) we get the Word of God." Last year, this same young man was refused time off to come to a DM2 workshop, so the day before the workshop he quit his job. Incredibly, a couple of days after the workshop, his boss called him and begged him to return to work.

On the last day, a young university student stood up and said he also was nearly unable to attend the workshop because of his classes. The young man said, "I started praying and my professor died." He was not making a joke, but it took five minutes for everyone to stop laughing!

The Bolivia O.T. workshop lasted five and a half days, from 7 am till after 10 pm. One evening we finished at 9:30 and everyone was upset that we did not continue. There is an enormous hunger for the Word of God in the vast majority world; people

are willing to sacrifice a great deal to receive sound Bible teaching.

On the last day of the workshop one of the pastors told me, "If you never come back to Santa Cruz again, I can assure you that the whole city now knows the Gospel." He said that throughout the city people are asking, "Did you know there is a group of pastors here in Santa Cruz that teaches that a person is saved by faith alone in Christ alone?" While they mean it for evil, God is using what they say for good, to spread the true Gospel message. (Philippians 1:15-18)

That evening, a group of pastors presented DM2 with an offering of \$200. This is a huge gift considering Bolivia is one of the poorest countries in South America. These pastors said, "We believe in what DM2 is doing and want to be a part."

Ryan Robinson said that the day after the conference the attendees shed many tears sharing what they had learned. One leader shared how he used to live for money, but now the Word of God has majorly changed his life and priorities.

Several Bolivian leaders we have taught are looking to the Lord to spread the DM2 model beyond their borders. One group of disciple-makers is planning to go to Mexico, another hopes to take the teaching to Ecuador, and yet others are desiring to take the teaching to Spain. They are moving forward trusting God to provide all they need.

DM2 wants to give you the privilege of getting involved in this exciting work!

OPEN LETTER FROM LARRY DEPUE (NTM Missionary in Bolivia)

I want to write you about a ministry I'm involved in that I think you might be interested in, too. It's called DM2, or Disciple Makers Multiplied. This ministry has been a big blessing here in Santa Cruz (Bolivia), and in the Churches de los Valles. Let me tell you what has happened.

DM2 started with the teaching of the book of Romans. They taught a verse by verse method that obviously camps on the more fundamental doctrines. It took 5 full days to teach Romans chapters 1 to 8: Justification only by faith in the substitutionary death and resurrection of Christ; sanctification by grace through faith in the power of the indwelling Holy Spirit; and glorification, our future assurance because of faith in Jesus Christ alone.

It has been such a blessing to hear men teaching these truths with conviction and passion. It is revolutionizing our churches. The teaching that has most impacted the churches and pastors has been the clear Gospel. Our Gospel was so confused and distorted by works; many people are finally coming to understand salvation. It's changing lives.

Another fundamental of the teaching is discipleship. It's happening ... others are teaching others, and they are teaching others. The reason I write this is that we need

teams that can travel and teach for a week or two at a time, a couple times a year in other countries. We would like to see this happening all over South America. If you like to teach the Word you would be blessed by, and would be a real blessing, in a ministry like this. Please look into it, and prayerfully consider it.

FROM DONNA BARKMAN:

Kids are the same no matter the continent they live on. They laugh, they play, they love, they giggle, they tattletale, they color, they're creative, some sit still, some just can't. But most importantly, kids everywhere are invited by Jesus to come, and He strongly reminds us not to hinder them from doing so.

I was privileged in early June to be part of a DM2 team that headed to Los Negros, a farming town in the mountains of Bolivia. For five days, I along with two other young ladies, had the opportunity to spend two hours daily with children from the community. Our group ranged in number from 20 to 30 kids, in age from about four to teen. The older ones listened attentively; the younger ones tried, they truly did. They even went so far as to "lock" their mouths and hand me their invisible keys. But, alas, sitting still is sometimes just nigh impossible!

The two hours were spent in games, Bible teaching, coloring, and hands-on activities. Our Bible lessons helped us see how the focus of the entire Bible is Jesus and what He has done for us. The story of Isaac, bound with cords on the altar and helpless to save himself, helped us understand that our sin is the cord which has us bound and helpless. Just as God provided a perfect lamb to die in place of Isaac, so He has provided the Perfect Lamb to die in place of us. The story of Noah and the one-door ark taught us that there is only one way to safety from eternal death. We learned that the common sheep pen of Jesus' day was like that one door on the ark. The one entrance to the sheep pen was guarded by the shepherd, who would give his life if needed in order to keep his sheep safe. These daily lessons and pictures always pointed the children to Jesus - the Perfect Lamb, the only place of safety, the Good Shepherd.

How many pictures throughout history our Heavenly Father has given us, all pointing to Christ, our perfect, sufficient

sacrifice. How kind of Him to make the message so clear that whether the listener be a wiggling young one, an attentive teen, or a studious adult, all can understand and all are invited to come!

FROM CASEY HUGHES:

In June I was blessed with the opportunity to travel with DM2 to Bolivia to help with the children's program. This was my first time in Bolivia, and I fell in love with the colorful country and its wonderful people. Enthusiastic, creative, intelligent, and cute are some words which describe the Bolivian children who came to the children's program. It was refreshing to see children excited about simple activities like coloring, and it was even more refreshing to see them understand Biblical truths. What a joy it was to interact with these precious children!

While I was in Los Negros, I also greatly enjoyed meeting the believers who attended the pastors' conference. Even though I don't speak Spanish, I felt right at home by the end of our stay. I think this was due to the common bond we share as brothers and sisters in Christ. It encouraged me to see these people sit through long hours of teaching from the Word of God and motivates me to study more diligently.

Traveling with DM2 was a true privilege. I thank God I was able to have a small part in what He is doing in Bolivia. It is an experience I will carry with me the rest of my life.

FROM MARGARET NAZWORTH:

When I found out that I had the opportunity to travel to Bolivia this summer, I was ecstatic. I was so happy I would have an opportunity to go overseas and share the gospel with Bolivian children. After many, many days of waiting, it was finally time to go. I woke up early, packed, and then headed off to the airport. After three exhausting flights and a five hour drive through the mountains, we arrived at our destination. We were worn out, but we were there.

The next day was the first children's class. As the class progressed, I saw how poor and needy all the children were; how badly they needed the Gospel. But I also realized my inadequacy in helping them. I am not fluent in Spanish, and I do not understand everything about their culture. There was no way I could help them on my own. I realized that only in God's strength could I give these children the most life-changing message in the world. The message that Christ died on the cross for us to pay for our sin, and that He rose from the dead. In the end, all the kids were able to hear this message, and that was worth the whole trip for me.
