My experience as a missionary to Zambia, Africa was profound and enriching. It was both eye- opening and humbling to witness the people's hunger for the word of God. Several attendees walked for miles to come sit through eight-hour days of teaching. Although they are used to hard manual labor to put food on the table for their families, they were willing to set that aside for the sake of the gospel and the truth of God's word. Their testimonies after the conference were encouraging. They were grateful to have understood a clear gospel presentation and to receive answers to some lingering questions. One of the attendees said, "Hearing the teaching of a clear gospel message was very

This was my first time outside the continent of North America, so I was a little nervous, but primarily excited. From start to finish the entire trip was a life experience I'll never forget. Once we began teaching, it was easy to see many of the people's yearning for the untainted word of God. One thing that particularly stood out to me was that despite a completely different country, a completely different culture, and a completely different language, there was a strong bond of Christian unity even though I had never met any of them previously. Our trip to Zambia was an amazing experience. Seeing the power of God's word on display was a huge encouragement. Numerous people said things like, "This is really beneficial to my Christian life and completely changes how I view the Bible."

One thing that was perspective-changing for me was how the people live. Zambia is a developing country. According to our guide, Humphrey, the average monthly wage for a general worker in that part of the country is 1,1000 Kwacha, which equals about \$45. The unemployment rate is high. Those who don't have conventional jobs have to make a living growing crops, fishing, raising animals, or working in the fields. Additionally, owning a car is a rare privilege. Most people get around by walking or cycling. The thing that was



quite convicting to me was their attitude toward life. Despite having a fraction of what the average American has, they were joyful and kind.

Because of their lack of material things, they are receptive to the gospel and God's word. Humphrey explained it this way: "Here in Zambia most of us wake up in the morning not knowing if we're going to have a job or even a meal today. But that just causes us to trust the Lord. We pray and He always provides. When you stop focusing on material things, you begin to see the depths of God's grace."

I went on this trip to teach, and I ended up learning a valuable lesson. Going to Zambia changed my perspective. God used this trip to teach me to be more content and grateful. - *Zephyr, 3DTC student*

This trip had its share of hardships, but all were worth it for the priceless opportunity of seeing lives changed. Teaching God's word to Zambians opened my eyes. In America, I might talk to my friends about high-speed Wi-Fi, the newest video games, or the most recent blockbuster. But in Zambia, none of these issues were relevant. Currently, Zambians are experiencing a drought, which forces them to enact rolling blackouts because most of their electricity comes from hydroelectric power. Though I could not talk about the things I am so privileged to have, I could talk about the gospel. God's truth reaches across cultural barriers and unites the church, allowing us to have fellowship with believers everywhere.
