To begin this New Year, we would like to update you on our missionaries.

Ryan and Carissa Robinson are in an interesting situation that warrants our united prayer. Upon arrival in Bolivia, the Robinsons went to an agent to aid them in getting their visas. This is standard practice. Unfortunately, this individual, who had been trustworthy in the past, took their money and went through the motions of applying for their visas, but never submitted their passports. Because of this, they have to pay over two thousand dollars in fines and start their visa applications from the beginning. Please pray for this.

All our missionaries are in need of additional financial support. Pray for John and Nelly Wry, Carlos and Amy Tellez, and Ryan and Carissa

Robinson as each of these families could see their support doubled and still be under-supported by most standards. They are each willing to be used of the Lord in ministry, but finances are a limiting factor. Please keep these families in prayer in 2013 as they each trust the Lord for needed provision.

God continues to use DM2 in incredible ways. We will be conducting our first conference in India in February. We are also seeing disciple-making take place in prisons, schools, and homes, both abroad and here in the US. Our first youth workshop on Romans 1-8 will be held in Tennessee in February.

The beauty of **disciple-making** is that it is **God-approved**, and **it works**. Pray for us as we seek to reach men and women from every tribe and tongue and nation with the life-changing Word of God.

DEC. BOLIVIA WORKSHOP

It was not the best of flights from Harlingen, Texas to Santa Cruz, Bolivia. We left home at 3:00 a.m. and arrived in Bolivia at 2:00 a.m. the next day. We began the workshop the same day we arrived. Humanly speaking, this trip would not have been possible.

Consider the work involved in translating over 170 pages of material for the Panorama of the Life of Christ in a very short period of time, in addition to translating all the PowerPoint slides and illustrations, as well as 570 pages of children's Sunday school lessons. The translated material was finished about a week before the trip. This left several team members, including myself, feeling as if there was insufficient time for preparing and studying. Not only that, but several team members were severely ill with stomach viruses. We were all sleep-deprived, going to bed well after midnight and waking up at around 6:00 a.m. each day to begin the conference at 7:00 a.m. We also miscalculated the amount of time it would take us to teach through each of our sections. Halfway through the conference, we were nearly a whole day behind schedule. When it looked like we were finally going to be able to catch up, the lights went out. Oh, how we prayed!

These, of course, were not normal circumstances. We were doing God's work in sharing His Word, and we were under His grace. God's grace is sufficient.

"And He said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me." (2 Corinthians 12:9)

I can see now that everything was done according to God's will. This trip to Bolivia was one of the most **successful** in terms of the **amount of material** we shared, our **fellowship** with the attendees, their **response** to the teaching, and how **Christ was glorified** through the teaching.

I am glad now that we did not have the ideal conditions we desired. It gave us an amazing opportunity to walk by faith

and trust the Lord and His ways.

This was my fifth trip to Bolivia, and from the beginning it had a different feel. For starters, two days before the trip, both my daughters were terribly sick. I prayed the Lord would give me the strength to leave my ailing children at my mom's and give me peace knowing that they would be fine. He did. My girls were much better a day after we left.

We had no trouble going through customs this time (usually there is one thing or another we have to explain). The first church we visited in Santa Cruz was very welcoming, and they even took up an offering for DM2. This was touching, knowing Bolivia is one of the poorest countries in South America. When the pastor mentioned they wanted to contribute toward the cause of spreading the gospel, I got a knot in my throat and it brought tears to my eyes.

After that service, we headed to Los Negros where the six-day pastors' conference and new children's curriculum were going to be taught. The conference was a success, with 115 people attending. Wanda and I taught the children's curriculum in the evenings. The teachers were very **receptive** to it and **excited** to teach the curriculum in their churches.

While in Los Negros, I kept thinking about the church that had so willingly contributed to DM2. To my surprise, at the end of the conference, the pastors in Los Negros also took up an offering for DM2. They collected twice as much as they were hoping for—\$1,200 USD, to be exact. Wow! It was clear they truly understood the cause. The wife of one of the pastors told me they were not seeing us as some "rich" Americans giving them books, but as true missionaries fulfilling the great commission, and **they wanted to be a part of that.**

I'm using the new **DM2 children's curriculum** for both of my grade 8 middle school classes here in Winnipeg, Canada. I use them once a week during the journaling time. I print out a lesson and give each student a copy. We read through it and highlight important concepts. I am teaching good note-taking, observing the main idea, and study skills. Then I give them some time to journal. I can't do all the lessons, so I am doing the lessons that directly tie in to the Gospel lessons at the end. I know you geared the lessons to a younger age, but the way we're working through them, they are very appropriate and applicable for my students. I very much enjoy using them with my students as they are understandable, practical, and applicable, with an understanding of **who the Deliverer is** right from the beginning.



UPDATE—CARLOS TELLEZ

One month ago, I started DM2 Romans 1-8 at the North Jail here in Charlotte, NC. Every Tuesday night, I have a group of fifteen Spanish-speaking inmates who come to be discipled for an hour and a half. By law, the group is limited to fifteen. The first night, we had eleven men come to believe in Christ. The second night, I brought some additional copies of the lesson for each of the inmates, **so they could teach the others** who were not permitted to attend the study. On this second visit, five more believed in Christ. On the third visit, another trusted the Lord as his Savior. We are studying the Romans curriculum page by page, so it will take many weeks to complete the course. However, all the men are excited to take this teaching to others behind bars. They are also writing their loved ones about what they are learning in hopes they too will come to know the truth. **Please pray** for this mission field and for its expansion to the English-speaking inmates.



During my time in Bolivia teaching through the Panorama of the Life of Christ, I was touched and encouraged by how many of the pastors and leaders have embraced the disciple-making model. They have implemented it in their churches and are bringing the concept to many regions of Bolivia. Their **testimonies** of how they have been **teaching** Romans and the Panorama of the Old Testament, and the difference it is making in their lives, were **amazing** for me to hear. After many hours of studying and traveling by air and land, I see that this great effort was completely worth it. The work has been warmly welcomed by loving brothers and sisters. We quickly **bonded** together in the **love of Christ**. I am thankful to the Lord that I was allowed to be a part of the training team with DM2 in Bolivia, South America.
