ROM 1-8 ASIA - BRAD RIGBY

From north to south, the country was dotted with temples to a man who died and remains dead. Under the tenets of this religion, there is no eternal God and if you live a moral life, you can become a god yourself.

However, in the darkness of such falsehood, there is at least one area in which there shines a light for Christianity. Among the people of that region, we taught principles contrary to the status quo. They heard about the eternal God, the Creator of the universe and the Creator of mankind, who became man and dwelt among us in the person of Jesus Christ. And while being both God and man, Jesus Christ delivered Himself up to death on a cross to die for sin as the substitute for all of mankind. Unlike the "god" who remains dead in his tomb, God the Father demonstrated his power over death by raising Jesus Christ on the third day. For this reason, Paul unequivocally stated in 1 Corinthians 15:3-4 that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, was buried, and raised again on the third day according to the Scriptures.

Meanwhile, before we were able to teach these truths in that unique city and to those believers, God allowed this rag-tag team of teachers to exercise faith in a deeper way than we have had to do on previous trips. For starters, in Houston we were almost prevented from leaving the U.S. because we did not have a visa stamped in our passports. (We had understood we could obtain a visa on arrival.) As a team we prayed and trusted that since God had commanded us to "go make disciples of all the nations" and since He has "all authority" we should go ahead and move forward by faith. Many of you prayed, and we can say that God intervened. After a considerable challenge by the airline, we were finally allowed to leave the country without a visa. Amazingly, in the two ensuing airports when we changed flights, the personnel never checked our passports for the required visas!

We faced our next challenge when we arrived at the country of our destination. The young immigration officer looked our paperwork over doubtfully and then questioningly showed it to his superior. All three of us stood there and silently prayed. The supervisor glanced at us, casually leafed through the documents, and then nodded approvingly as if not wanting to be bothered. Minutes later, we all had our visas and were in the country. This was an amazing moment of divine intervention. At that point, we thought our challenges and obstacles were over, but they had only begun.

Since the Romans workshop we had gone to present was slated to begin Monday morning in a town to the north, we immediately made our way to the national airport. We were told there were no flights on any airline into that area until Monday afternoon. This was not good since we only had 5 days to present our workshop. So, by faith we took a flight to the closest city. This did take us closer to our final destination geographically, but not time wise.

We had left our homes on Thursday, and we arrived at this interior location on Saturday evening. We were exhausted, but after some research we were told there were no connecting flights available to our last stop for two more days. The training was to begin first thing Monday morning. That night we earnestly prayed again for the Lord to provide the way for us to arrive on time. The way God provided was not in a way you'd wish even on your enemies.

After a much needed night's sleep in this town, we again moved forward by faith. We took a taxi that took us to a bus. As the bus meandered throughout the countryside, we became doubtful we were heading in the right direction. We were supposed to go north and west, but, according to the sun, we were obviously going south. Since we did not speak the language, questions were useless. We continued to pray and journey onward. Finally, through broken communication, the locals instructed us to get off the bus in a small town. Then they hauled us to another bus station in a motorized rickshaw. We were told to wait all that day and that the bus would leave at 5:00 PM Sunday afternoon.

Later that evening, our bus arrived and we began an unforgettable fourteen-hour overnight ride. The bus was packed with locals and their goods. Our journey took us along a one lane road through the steep mountains and over deep gorges, dodging other buses, motorcycles, and vehicles all the way. With each turn in the mountain road, the bus swayed precariously. At one point, we stopped on a spill way and were guided by men with flashlights. When bridges were out, the bus braved the waters of the rivers, with the water rising above the level of the tires. Needless to say, we all got caught up on our prayer life!

Amazingly, after a sleepless night, we arrived at our destination with thirty minutes to spare before the training was scheduled to begin. We were soon checked into a hotel, and after quickly bathing and changing, we went straight to the place of training. We had not eaten anything of substance for more than 24 hours. Nonetheless, we started the workshop by 8:45 AM, probably a record for a first day on-time start anywhere that DM2 goes.

We completed teaching Romans chapters 1-7 and part of 8 and challenged the attendees to become disciple-makers. The Lord provided approximately 20-25 students each day, consisting of four or five pastors, three church elders, and about sixteen Bible college students. The students, both old and young, sat for over seven hours of teaching each day on low hard benches to hear God's Word. Matthew, a teacher at a local Bible College, was our translator for the week. The teaching was well received and the people were very appreciative.

Following the training sessions, our challenges were not over!

First of all, we had to choose between missing a day and a half of teaching and getting a flight out. We chose to stay and teach, not knowing how we would get back to the capital airport and dreading another bus ride. Thankfully, the Lord provided a flight on a government airline, which prevented us from suffering the long mountain bus ride again. The forty-five minute flight cut out many hours of travel. Providentially, the Lord provided Alfred, a retired pastor, who was traveling on the same flight with us. Amazingly, he guided us as translator the rest of the way back to the capital, changing his travel plans in order to accompany us. We did have another long bus ride as part of our return trip, but that trip was on roads that were much better than the first trip we took.

This trip was not for the faint-hearted! In all, getting to our destination took over three days of difficult travel by planes, taxis, buses, and motorized rickshaws; however, this trip challenged me as a teacher of the Word to apply moment by moment the very principles we teach. I can say that the Christian life is truly a walk (ride) of faith. God directed our paths, but we had to trust Him at every turn. Proverbs 3:5-6

The word I kept repeating throughout this trip was "wow". During this initial trip to this undisclosed country, the Lord kept amazing me with His abundant provisions. It most certainly was a difficult trip in many ways, but it also proved to me that we can walk by faith in our daily lives and specifically as He uses us to fulfill His Great Commission. I cannot adequately explain it, but the following are just some of the examples of His work.

Before we even left, during our 10 hour layover in Houston, the Lord provided the information we would need to acquire our visas upon arrival into the country. Next, He provided a key person at the ticket counter who, upon reviewing our documents, approved us for travel. Once in the country, God provided buses when there were no planes, and the wisdom to know where to get on them. He provided people to direct us to those buses when we had no human way of finding them. Finally, after a 14 hour overnight bus ride (over 75 hours of travel overall) through the forest and mountains on a dirt road, He got us to the workshop just in time to teach as scheduled.

God then provided students who were eager for His Word.

Many of these were leaders with the ability to make disciples once properly equipped. He gave them all the physical strength and willing spirit to endure long hours of teaching in difficult conditions, and He gave us the ability to effectively communicate through the language and cultural barriers.

On the way back, He provided a man at the airport, whom we

had never met, to escort us to the international airport from which we were to begin our flights home. Since we were not able to get a flight to the capital city, we needed this man's help to know where to go to get a bus to take us to where we needed to be. Not only did this man help us, but as it turned out, he is a former pastor at a church that has a solid Biblical foundation and great connections in the local community. He could be a very valuable resource as DM2 looks forward to ministering in this field over the next 10 years. The Lord then got us to Houston an hour early, just in time to catch early flights home and avoid a long layover in the Houston airport.

Wow! We have an amazing God. I thank God for this opportunity to see Him at work. I thank everyone for their prayers and support. I thank Bret for his leadership and dedicated service to the Lord. I thank Brad for his friendship and his commitment to disciple making.
