I have taught in-depth Bible studies in the past, but there's something about believing in and teaching about future events that has emboldened me. You either stand for God or you stand with Satan. Somehow, it's not the same as teaching systematic theology or some academic course. You teach by standing in faith. It just seems different to me.

The ladies in the class and I agree that studying Revelation changes the way you look at the world. Because we have been studying for over 5 months now, "the things of earth grow strangely dim in the light of His glory and grace." Knowing that this earth is currently ruled by Satan, why do we even want to be a part of it? I long for Christ's return. I realize that this earthly plane is what we know, but I regret going along with it. I regret choices I've made. I long for so much more. I've always known "all that glitters is not gold," and now, I realize in a deeper way that gold is only glitter.

Last fall I saw a quote that says, "God often has good things He wants to give us, but our hands are too full to receive them." That thought was one of the many signals God used to make me want to retire. And now as a retired public-school teacher, I still get to do one of my favorite things: teach!

A few of the ladies I teach want to be trained to share the gospel. We are always praying for God to show us what to do and how to do it. We are really focusing on redeeming the time God's way. Would you pray for us?
