It is what occurred at one of these workshops that I would like to share. We were nearing the end of the workshop and had just finished reading dozens of verses confirming our security in Christ due to His faithfulness and promises to us. As soon as we opened up for questions, an elderly gentleman at the back spoke up: "We agree that salvation is a gift of grace, but what happens if you lose that gift?" He continued to explain how a family member had fallen into sin and had obviously, according to his understanding, lost his salvation.

Once more we tried to explain that since salvation is a gift, it can't be lost. This resulted in a lot of loud discussion between those who insisted that if a person has unconfessed sin at the point of death he or she will be lost eternally and those who believed that believers cannot lose their salvation.

In the midst of this, as Carlos explained in more detail what the Bible says, I noticed that near the front of the room a couple of visiting pastors were disapproving. As I watched, their opposition grew stronger and louder: "Yeah, yeah, whatever you say. Let's just get this over with. Give us our books so we can go home."



I wondered how I could help them better understand that salvation is solely a work of God's grace totally apart from any human effort. I sent up a silent prayer and pulled a chair next to them. Putting my arm on one of the pastor's shoulders, I kindly asked, "What is your real concern?" He began to explain that they believe salvation is like any other gift. Though you receive it for free, you have to take care of it or you may lose it. As I listened, God gave me the words to address his concern.

However, by this time the meeting had clearly reached an impasse, so we ended in the customary Bolivian way, with prayer and an opportunity for those in attendance to share testimonies. As one of the pastors I had just talked to made his way to the front, I thought, "Oh, no! Here we go!" But what happened next left me in tears (of joy that is).
