This name translates to: EVANGELICAL TEMPLE OF THE UNION OF CHURCHES THAT MEET IN THE NAME OF THE LORD JESUS CHRIST. It is a great name.

This church also welcomed us with open arms and took care of us as we continued to deal with our illnesses. There were a few challenges in this congregation, but after some explanation, they understood the teaching of God's word, and we praised the Lord.

I now have a new list of Christian family members to pray for. I hope you will join me in praying for these believers in Mexico.
