### Attendee Observations:

**Kevin Isafas Ramirez Serpas:** What I liked most was the way the importance of love in the churches was explained. It helped me better understand how we should behave as believers according to these biblical principles. It also made me see how important it is to have fellowship with God. As a children's Sunday school teacher, I have taught topics related to evangelism and as a local church we have been studying the DM2 Romans 1-8 curriculum. This has been of great help in the daily lives of all.



**Patricia Solórzano:** What struck me the most was the duty of pastors and leaders to make believers within the church see sin biblically, and not to be silent or just contemplate the sin, especially public sins, as well as the young man who committed the sin of incest.

**Jakeline Gabriela Sánchez:** The part I liked the most was how the importance of love as the basis of everything in the Christian life was explained, especially in chapter 13. It helped me a lot to understand how to live in unity and correct my attitudes that are not pleasing to God. I was shocked to see how the church in Corinth was facing many problems similar to those of today, such as divisions, pride, etc.

**Lilian Beatriz Ortez de Castro:** What I liked most was understanding the importance of serving the Lord in love, just as God loved us. The other teaching that struck me was the importance of serving the Lord by faith and not by sight - living by faith and being a church that pleases God.

**Samuel Isaac Salgado:** What I liked most was understanding that you must know the context of the passage in detail to understand and discern the scriptures correctly. I was shocked to see how the problems of the Corinthians, such as living the Christian life in carnality and not according to God's desires, are the same as those of most churches. The teaching motivates me to preach to my friends who have false doctrine about the correct context of the letter 1 Corinthians.

**Vilma Esperanza Ortéz de Crúz:** I liked the depth with which the topics were addressed, the clarity of the practical challenges, and the focus on the importance of spiritual gifts in the body of Christ. I was struck by the realization that love is the basis of all Christian service. Without Christ our actions lose their spiritual value. Also, the call to holiness and purity in the church, reminding me that we are a temple of the Holy Spirit.

**Cristina Lourdes Solis:** I liked that the studies were explained in a very clear and orderly way. I was struck by the theme of Christ's resurrection and how Paul explains that our bodies will be transformed, "glorified," to be forever with our Lord. Also, the teaching and the role that women have in worship in our congregations. This is my first time participating in these conferences, but I am sure that what I have learned I will share with other believers for personal edification and for the edification of the body of Christ.

**William Josué Magaña Cruz:** What I liked most was being able to understand in detail what my role is in the church and to understand what the functions of the gifts are. To understand that God does not need me to expand His kingdom, but He decided, out of His mercy, to take me into account to serve. I was struck by the understanding that we must preach the gospel without judgment, seeing the need to share the gospel with everyone.

**Josselyn Itzel Salgado Solórzano:** I liked how clearly the letter explains how we should live the Christian life, reflected in unity, love, and corresponding Christian behaviors, but above all putting Christ at the center of our lives. I was struck by the importance of love and good decisions within marriage, the importance and necessity of preaching the gospel (by grace) without judging people but making them know the true gospel. I was also impacted by understanding the importance of leadership within the church.

**Elva Rhina Zometa:** What I liked about the conference was being able to study verse by verse and to be able to understand in depth the importance that men have within the direction and growth of the local church. Similarly, the way they explained the issue of marriage. All the topics really showed us how great and wonderful it is to know and study the word of God and to be able to grow in the way of the Lord and preach the love and sacrifice that was made on the Cross. One of the things that struck me the most was that 1 Corinthians strengthens and shows the way we live our faith and the choices we make in our lives. Paul urges us to have unity with one another since we are one body in Christ.

**Mirna Perdomo:** I liked the methodology, the disposition of the speakers, the foundation of the teaching, the accessibility to answer questions, the learning acquired, and the excellent logistics organized by the host church. I am shocked to know in detail the truths written in the letter of 1 Corinthians.
