Kelly Rants: This summer I had the privilege of going to Zambia as a teacher during the DM2 Romans 1-8 conference. I had never taught outside the country. I had not even left the country since I was a year old. I had no idea what to expect!

Zambia is a very hardy country. The people do not live like Americans. Outside the cities, they live communally and produce and sell their wares for a living. Their day ends when the sunlight does. To see how deeply their faith is involved in their everyday life was encouraging and convicting in the deepest way.



While there are many evident British and American influences, Zambia retains a deep sense of self and national pride.

There are many religious influences outside of Christianity. To have faith in many things, whether it's doctors and witch doctors, or God and works, is very pervasive. Through the teaching, we had the opportunity to focus on the importance of relying on God alone.

While the journey there and back was difficult, the fruit we saw in just one week of teaching and the growth in the attendees was a blessing only the Lord could provide, and one I believe He will use for his glory throughout Zambia and its surrounding nations.

When we went to purchase the tickets, however, the plane was full. The only way we could then get to Kasama was by driving. Without hesitation, our driver Humphrey offered to take us. He gave up a week of his life and time with his family to drive us two days to Kasama, stay there for the duration of the conference, and then drive all the way back. On the way there, we were able to encourage Humphrey to attend the conference, which he very faithfully did. About the middle of the week, when we were talking about gospel confusions, Humphrey told the team, "I always had heard and thought the gospel was about asking Jesus into my heart and confessing Jesus (publicly), but now I know it is just believing, no other requirements." If Humphrey had been the only one to hear the truth and have his mind changed, then our trip would have been a success; but it was not just Humphrey. Over eighty pastors and ministry leaders attended the conference and came to similar conclusions. I am so thankful God allowed me to be a part of this experience.
