What's Happening in Liberia?

Recently, 70 pastors, teachers, and young people walked, hitchhiked, and rode motorcycles (sometimes three or four on one motorcycle) to participate in the February DM2 workshop in Liberia. Many traveled several hours on dirt or pothole-filled roads. The teachers, however, were thousands of miles away in the United States. How was this possible? It was possible through a collaborative effort involving modern technology and a great deal of innovation.

For pastor John Clark and me, it was only a matter of getting up early (there's a five-hour time difference) and joining a Zoom meeting on our laptop computers. For those in Liberia, however, it was a different story. They did the work of setting up a portable electric generator; putting together a makeshift wi-fi using a cell phone, scratch off data cards, wires, and a small black box; hanging up a large bed sheet as a projection screen and connecting an old projector and large speaker to the black box. Did it work? Yes, it did! At least most of the time. On occasion, we had to wait while the generator was being refueled. Sometimes, the wi-fi dropped out or the data stopped transmitting. Other times, the sound or video (or both) went dead for no apparent reason and the connection process had to be started all over again. The overall result? Just as planned. After three days of expositional teaching, another large group of believers joyfully and successfully completed a DM2 workshop.

By God's grace, the ministry of DM2 in Liberia has been thriving despite travel restrictions. Over the past two years, pastors and young people alike are taking the initiative by planning and teaching workshops in areas where we could never go. Not long ago, a team of young people led by Pastor George Paye (our

DM2 coordinator in Libera), traveled to a remote village to evangelize and teach a portion of Romans 1-8. Following the trip, I spoke to pastor Paye on WhatsApp. He told me that he felt that many people, including many children, had heard the gospel of grace for the first time and believed. I asked him if there was a place to stay in the village? He said, "No, we slept outside on the ground every night."









Pastor Paye and his team have been doing similar workshop trips on a monthly basis except during the rainy season when the roads are impassable. This is in addition to the workshops and meetings that we are now having regularly with them on Zoom.

We long for the day when we can once again travel to Liberia to teach the Word and fellowship with our Liberian brothers and sisters face to face.
