



DM2 Campus Ministry

On April 20, Dr. Titus Kennedy presented "Jesus in History and Archaeology" to a room of around 350 students, professors, and community members who were both believers and unbelievers. He shared about Christ's birth, death, and resurrection as recorded in history and archaeology, and encouraged those in attendance to read the gospels for themselves to learn more about Him. Following the presentation, we had a Q&A where attendees asked questions about Dr. Kennedy's faith and academic career as well as the historicity of the Bible and Christ's claims to deity. Afterwards there was a reception where those who came could personally ask Dr. Kennedy questions. Throughout the evening members of Campus Crusade and DM2 Campus Ministry helped with handing out information and directing people to the auditorium. Following the event, they collected response cards from those who were there about their thoughts on the presentation. Many Christians shared how this had encouraged their way of looking at being a Christian and being in academia. A few unbelievers turned in response cards sharing that they wanted to learn more about Christ. We now are working on follow up. Please pray for all who attended, for their encouragement, and especially for those who were not believers that they would want to know more about Christ's death and resurrection and what it means for them. In this all, it is so amazing to me to see how over this past year God worked this out through a small group of believers on a college campus in Washington State. With this, I want to encourage you that just as the Lord used us, He can use you wherever you are to share the Gospel and His Word with those around you!
