A man's heart devises his way: but the LORD directs his steps.

When things seem to whirl out of control it is always good to remember that God is in control.

In less than a week, DM2 will be hosting its first workshop in America. We have guests coming from Africa, Bolivia, and several states here in the U.S.A. Together with Pleroma Bible Church, we are excitedly putting together the last minute details.

In the midst of preparing for this conference, I am getting invitations and pleas from other countries to teach pastors and leaders.

After our recent visit to Chile, we received a formal invitation from one of the pastors to start workshops there.

Two days ago, I received a plea from a pastor in India to come teach pastors in that country.

Also, we are in the process of working out the details to begin a work in North Africa.

At the same time, we are making preparations for two trips in May and June.

The field director in Africa, Michael Turay, is presently teaching in Romania. When he returns, he will be scurrying around completing preparations for the DM2 May workshop in Sierra Leone. The plan is for John Clark, Robert Ferow, and me to teach 50 - 60 leaders.

Two weeks after I return from Africa, we will be off to Bolivia to teach the Panorama of the Old Testament curriculum.

A whirlwind of events is happening in Bolivia. Just today our field director, Roberto Morales, informed us that this week six teachers are giving a workshop in the small village of Pampa Grande. Another missionary, John Wry, shared that last night he "nailed down" a workshop for the month of August with Swiss missionaries from the town of San Ignacio de Moxos. According to John, these missionaries were so excited they were almost "hitting the roof" with excitement. Then, just a few days ago, we learned that from April 5 – 9 there will be two conferences taught simultaneously in Monteagudo: One in Spanish and another in a tribal dialect. We also learned through an email that Javier, a DM2 trainee, is going into Argentina to teach a workshop on the book of Revelation. His hope is that this workshop will lead to a DM2 disciple-making program in Argentina.

In May, our first DM2 missionaries, Ryan and Carissa Robinson, will be heading to Bolivia for a year. Besides learning language, they will be teaching and ministering to disciple-makers there.

As you might expect, keeping up with all this is exhausting. It reminds me of what Paul said when speaking of making-disciples... (Christ...) whom we preach, warning every man, and teaching every man in all wisdom; that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus: Whereunto I also <u>labor</u> $(\kappa o \pi \iota \tilde{\omega} - toil to the point of exhaustion), <u>striving</u> <math>(\dot{\alpha} \gamma \omega \nu \iota \zeta \dot{\omega} \mu \epsilon \nu \sigma \zeta - laboring fervently, fighting vigorously) <u>according to his working</u>, which works in me mightily.
