

As I write this article, I am busy preparing for the Panorama of the Old Testament conference in Bolivia. What went into making this trip possible? A myriad of particulars had to be worked out. Tickets, passports, visas, and vaccinations for each team member had to all be acquired. Equipment and appropriate books had to be purchased. One of the most crucial components was the development and translation of curriculum. Student outlines and PowerPoint presentations also had to be created.

Each of these details takes effort and preparation. As God opens doors to more and more fields, we are greatly encouraged by believers who willingly provide resources to see disciple makers multiplied around the world!

In Bolivia we will be teaching the Panorama of the Old Testament curriculum developed by Pastor Clay Ward. A sister in Christ in Santiago (the capital of Chile) freely gave of her time to translate all 175 pages of this curriculum into Spanish! Many others provided financially to make the trip possible.

Last week, Robert Ferow, John Clark, and I returned from an exhilarating workshop in Sierra Leone, Africa. There is nothing like hungry — truly hungry — leaders who, above all else, desire to be taught the Word of God. The men and women who attended this conference waited eagerly to get us out of bed each morning for another long day of teaching.

Between the Africa and Bolivia trips, we had a quick Romans 1-8 workshop here in Tennessee. This workshop was aimed at preparing our two newest Regional Ministry Directors, Carlos Tellez and Brad Rigby, for teaching Romans.

Carlos and Amy Tellez are our newest DM2 members. Carlos will be focusing on the Spanish speaking people of the US and Latin America. Brad Rigby is working with us by-vocationally. He is our Regional Ministry Director for North Africa. While working full-time, Brad is coordinating the translation of all our materials into Arabic, along with fully organizing the workshops in North Africa. This is no small matter, and we ask for much prayer. Besides the spiritual conflict we face, the language, distance, and political situation make Brad's job a great challenge.

We are so thankful to God for providing willing laborers. Continue to pray for us. Thank *you* for your part!

I wanted to let you know that in March I was in Mexico. During my stay there, I met precious brothers and sisters from a church in our denomination. Through these people, we are making contacts to initiate a workshop in Mexico. I spoke to Pastor Roberto (DM2 Bolivia Field Director) concerning this, and he really wants to go. I am communicating with a leader from the church in Mexico (Cosme Sanchez) who proved to be very interested in the workshop. We are simply waiting on specifics concerning dates and participants. Let's hope that the doors open to initiate this new location for Bible teaching.

FROM BOLIVIA: The Robinsons

The trip down to Bolivia was good but difficult. When we arrived in Bolivia in the wee hours of the morning, Aydon and Emma were extremely tired, and it was very hot. We were trusting God to carry us through, and a friendly worker gathered all our luggage, then moved us to the front of the line, "por los niños" (for the kids).

We rode up to Mairana the next day. Mairana is a three hour drive from Santa Cruz. The drive was beautiful, but getting into the mountains the road winds and twists. Without seatbelts and car seats you can imagine how we got tossed around in the car. I won't mention all the times our driver decided to pass giant semis as we were going around hairpin turns with steep (though breathtakingly beautiful) drop-offs on either side.

We are running a small church for the Sommers (the missionaries whose house we are staying in while they are on furlough) each Sunday and Wednesday night. The people are laid back and friendly. Aydon really likes the church group. He greeted everyone with "buenos dias" on Wednesday night.

In Santa Cruz we met a man who helps people secure their visas. He knew exactly what papers and pictures we needed. He will give us a card in a few weeks confirming that we have applied for our visas, so we are good to stay here for one year! Praise God!

JOINING DM2: Tellez Family

Carlos Tellez knew that one day God would open the door for him to teach sound biblical doctrine to fellow Spanish-speaking believers. After nearly ten years of waiting upon the Lord, this door has been opened through DM2!

Carlos grew up in Colombia, South America. He finished his Bachelor's degree in business administration, but knew he was being called into full time ministry from the day of his salvation. The Lord miraculously opened a door for him to come to the US to study English and get a Master's degree in Bible Exposition. Sound Bible teaching and training are not available to many Latin American Christians, so Carlos' dream since graduating has been to teach and disciple pastors and church leaders on an advanced level.

Carlos and his wife Amy live in Charlotte, NC with their three children, Caleb (9), Noah (7) and Grace (4). The mission field has been on their hearts for a long time, and finally God has led them to a mission organization that is like-minded in all aspects.
